Foreword

Seva-in-Action(SiA) steps into 29th year working in the field of disabilities with the mission of providing equitable opportunities and creating inclusion for persons with disabilities besides sensitizing the larger society to understand and value differences or diversity which is an integral part of the social fabric. It was an eventful year for the organization with Mahalakshmi a trainee in skill development unit of SiA was elected as the national chairperson for Self Advocates forum for Intellectual disabled person (SAFI) which was the highest recognition of SiA's work for persons with intellectual disability. SiA received the Best NGO State Award for its work for children with disabilities which included the trophy and cash prize of Rupees 1 lakh. The award was given by the Department of Women and Child Welfare, GOK. Honourable Minister for Women & Child Development inaugurated the renovated building of SiA built for Resource, Research and Training. Badathe Kadam a pan India awareness program was also flagged off by her. With SiA work under National Trust and the State Govt, Honourable Chief Minister in his state budget for 2014 -15 allocated Rs 1cr for Niramaya (Health Insurance Scheme) for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

With new draft law taken up by the Rajya Sabha there was immense hope for the disability sector to have a new law with the human right's emphasis which meets the aspirations of persons with disabilities. Once the law is enacted inclusive education shall be the only option for the education of children and adults with disabilities which therefore calls for systemic change in the field of education. SiA has taken up the task for assisting the State Education Department by working with DSERT to include inclusive education as an organizing principle in the D.Ed. teacher education course, thereby implementing the IE component with RV Education Consortium, teacher training institute and DIET by training teacher educators, student teachers and developing necessary resources as source book, IE portal and inclusive learning resources to create inclusive classrooms.

Every organization needs to develop and give responsibility to the next in line to take forward its vision and mission. The management of SiA has appointed Manjula Nanjundaiah as the Executive Director who has been with SiA for the past 25 years to be responsible for the overall development of the organization as a training, resource and research Institute. Varada Hedge who also has been working with SiA for the past 25 years was appointed as Deputy Director Services to develop the service delivery component of SiA

SiA takes this opportunity to thank Govt of Karnataka which has been very understanding regarding the needs of persons with disabilities and also collaborated with SiA to take services for persons with intellectual disabilities to the unreached districts. Our special thanks to the Honorable Minister for Women& Child Development and Kannada & Culture Smt. Umashree for her commitment to the cause and ensured allocation in the state budget for Niramaya Scheme. Our sincere thanks to the Director for Empowerment of Differently abled & Senior Citizens Sri. Jaya Vibhava Swamy for his concern for this sector. SIA also thanks NT, MSJ&E, MHRD, NGO partners for their support for this cause. Our special thanks to forever support of volunteers. The most significant SiA team for their concern and relentless commitment for taking the organization to newer heights.

ACTION FOR INCLUSION – URBAN RESOURCE CENTRE

Working towards developing an inclusive society

IE Inclusive Education for Pre-Service Teacher Education at Elementary Level A collaborative effort to Research and Implement Curriculum in Karnataka

Seva-in-Action in collaboration with RVEC, DSERT & VSEI has taken up a project under UNICEF and DSERT, GOK on Inclusive Education (IE) for Teacher Education at Elementary level. It is a collaborative effort to research and implement IE in Karnatakaas an organizing principle in the D.Ed. pre service teacher education course, thereby conducting teacher training institute and DIET by training teacher educators, student teachers and developing necessary resources as source book, IE portal and inclusive learning resources to create inclusive classroom and support the professional development in inclusive education.

Objectives:

- 1. To analyze the current situation vis-à-vis diversity in elementary schools
- 2. To develop IE materials and resources for:
 - D.Ed. Classrooms / Schools (during practice teaching/ internship)/ Capacity enhancement of teacher educators
- 3. To pilot the IE materials and resources in 2 D.Ed. Colleges from one district and 8 schools from one block:
- 4. To equip and strengthen Resource Centers in DIETs, BRC and CRC for implementation of IE.

1. Field Study

Selected 8 researchers were oriented to map the profile of classrooms in terms of diversity and identify needs of diverse groups of children in 19 selected schools in Karnataka.

Studied the needs of teachers and the challenges they experience in handling diverse classrooms and in practicing inclusion



2. Research, Development &Field testing of IE materials/resources

- IE materials and resources were developed & tried out
- Evolved modes of assessments and evaluation of student teachers
- Analysis and documentation was done

3. Developing IE Resource Centre

- IE resource persons at DIET Resource Centre were oriented to use and creation of resources for implementing inclusive education programme in the district.
- A portal for Inclusive education was developed for providing technology and information and provisions for children with disabilities. In addition other

- disadvantaged groups shall be for the education community and teachers specifically.
- A Resource center was set up at DIET with necessary teaching learning materials, equipment, computers for supporting professional development and resource creation in IE.

<u>International level Consultancy for developing Inclusive Education in Ethiopia</u>



Mrs. Ruma Banerjee & Ms. Manjula Nanjundaiah from Seva-in-Action had IE consultation (South to South) with the Education & Livelihood of Girls & Women Project of Handicap National in Ethiopia on invitation by Disability & Development Partner (DDP), UK. The objective of the visit to Hawasain Ethiopia was to understand the issues of girls & women focusing on disability observing different by activities which being

implemented by Handicap National under the ELGW Project funded by DDP.

Our trip to Ethiopia was productive and indeed a great opportunity for us to observe and learn about the issues in that part of the continent. It enriched our learning as we visited the field and met stakeholders of DDP's Hawasa Project. It was fruitful to discuss with some of the professionals and support rendered to IE. We found that in higher education and professional development of special teachers, Ethiopia's policies are more progressive than India. India still practices the medical model which is hurdle to implement IE. Such initiatives in Ethiopia could be still developed further which needs to be explored based on the resources available in African context.

Infrastructure development

The Renovation of SiA Building 'Seva Gangothri' in Koramangala was completed with the Govt. of Karnataka fund and it was inaugurated by, Honourable Minister, for Women& Child Development, and Kannada & Culture Smt. Umashreeon 8th November 2013. It is spacious with adequate area



available for running different activities in the Centre viz., Skill Development & Livelihood Unit, Library, Training Hall, Resource Centre, well defined cubicle for staff to work, board room, conference hall, a centre for imparting computer skills, multipurpose hall and sufficient toilets including disabled friendly toilets on all the three floors. The building was made accessible to persons with disabilities by making ramp and setting up a small lift. The organization has made provision of 1000 sq.ft space for commercial activity to sustain Seva-in-Action services.



The construction of three classrooms & toilets for rural resource centre of Seva-in-Action in Hoskote is completed and centre is ready to start functioning.

The construction of Ramanagara Samvardhana School, a resource centre of Seva -in - Action is still in progress with support from MP development fund and generous local donations.

Celebration of 29 years of seva-in-action

Seva-in-Action celebrated its 29 years of foundation day i.e. 3 April 2014, Thursday in its premises with guests Sri. Sreedhar Sagarji & Sri. Sureshji from HSP and management members. 1. Samvardhana Resource Centre, Ramanagara

World's Disabled Day

One day workshop on 'Language & Communication' was organised at Ramanagara by Bangalore Chapter with the support of Dr.Shivshankar, HOD, Dept. of Speech Pathology & Audiology as part of World's Disabled day on 18 Dec'13. It was decided on the 11 Dec'13 meeting with the Director of Dept. of Woman & Child Development of Ramanagara Dist, District Officer of Empowerment of Differently abled & Senior Citizens, other NGOs and VRWs & MRWs. The responsibility of organising the workshop was given to Seva-in-Action.

The topics covered in the workshop were brief introduction to the structure of the ear, function of the ear; distinguish between language & speech, role of sensory

organs, management, training & medical provisions, and significance of education and role of the society. The workshop was conducted with the support of the following resource persons:

- 1. Dr. M.N. Nagaraj from Dr. Chandrasekhar's Speech & Hearing Institution, Bangalore
- 2. Dr. M.S.J Naik, Director, Nayak's Speech & Hearing Institution, Bangalore
- 3. Dr. Praveen Kumar, Director, Hearing & Language services, Karnataka Ltd. Bangalore

Around 150 persons comprising of parents, VRWs & MRWs, teachers and the DD of Woman & Child Development, District Officer of Empowerment of Differently abled & Senior Citizens and Samvardhana Resource Centre's members participated in the workshop. The participants clarified their doubts & found some

solutions to their problems through question & answer session.

Felicitation

The Samvardhana Resource Centre of Seva-in-Action at Ramanagara has been recognised as "Best NGO" for its best services in the field of welfare of persons with disabilities in Ramanagara Dist by the District Office of



the Empowerment of Differently Abled & Senior Citizens. The organization is covering RamanagaraTaluk with various interventions for children and adults with disabilities which range from early intervention, Preparatory/School Readiness,



Inclusive Education - Resource Support to regular schools, counselling & guidance, advocacy, human resource development, skill development & livelihood activities.

Mrs. Vanajakshi Hegde, a senior most resource teacher from Samvardhana Resource Centre of Seva-in-Actionwas felicitated on 26th December

2013 on the occasion of World's Disabled Day in Ramanagara by the District Office of the Empowerment of Differently Abled & Senior Citizens.

Self-Advocacy Training

Seva-in-Action started one batch of self-advocacy training for 8 adults with disabilities in Ramanagara, rural project of Seva-in-Action. This was conducted by two mentors Ms. VanajakshiHegde& Ms. Varada Hegde who trained the batch of

self-advocates. The impact of the SA training was celebration of Sankranti festival in the centre by SAs themselves starting from planning till the execution. The co-operation among all 8 adults with disabilities was good. The training encouragedthem tostart thinking, express their wishes and perform work at home independently.



Changes in Self Advocates after the Training

Pavan who is 18 yrs. old has severe cerebral palsy. He completed his schooling successfully. His father did not allow him to study further .He wanted his son to be inside home but his mother being very co-operative brought him to Samvardhana Resource Centre for the training. She ensured that they reached home before Pavan's father reaches home. Now Pavan has confidence that he can perform activities and follow instructions. He has started doing his daily rituals at home himself. Mother of the child is very happy seeing this change in him given the stupendous contributions from her end. He had come with his mother to adventurous camp organised by Seva-in-Action at Ramanagara. Now he wants to do some vocational training.

Pradeep who is 26 yrs old is intellectually challenged & has no parents. He is living with his brother & sister. He often feels helpless and has sense of fear in performing activities. During the training of self-advocates, he was made the king and his friends decorated him. He was extremely excited & felt that it was the happiest moment in his life. He shared his happiness by showing the dress to local committee members & asked mentors to distribute sweets to all to celebrate the occasion.

Now he wants to live independently by take up some work and needs co-operation from family members for this.

2. Seva-in-Action Resource Centre, Hoskote, Bengaluru Rural Dist.



The Hoskote Resource Centre of Seva-in-Action is functioning in the new three room building constructed with the support of Round Table. The electricity & water connections are done for the building with the support of local level committee. The senior resource teacher of the centre quit job as she had some personal commitments. One local person is temporarily appointed & providing the training to her to continue the service at

the centre. However there is need to appoint trained teacher for the centre.

The Town Municipal Office provided fund of Rs.41,265 to Seva-in-Action under 3% allocation reserved for welfare of persons with disabilities to procure teaching & learning materials& candle making moulds for the resource centre of Hoskote.

3. Urban Resource Centre of Seva-in-Action, Koramangala, Bengaluru

<u>Skill Development & Livelihood Unit for young adults</u>
Making differently-abled young adults productive members of the society

Employment

<u>Urban Centre (Koramangala) - RACHANA</u>

Seva-in-Action runs the skill development and livelihood unit for the disabled persons in its urban resource centre in Koramangala, Bangalore. There are 31 adults with disabilities (majority of them are persons with intellectual disabilities) presently engaged in different types of skill work and they are engaged in the following activities:

- 1. **Making Paper Bags** Handmade paper bags, brown sheet bags, newspaper bags, brown sheet bag lining with cloth inside & gift bags.
- 2. **Weaving Foot Mats** Old cloth mats & Jute Mats.
- 3. **Making Candles** Mold candles, Gel candles& Wax diyas (Seasonal)
- 4. **Making Terracotta Pots** Designing & painting pots.

This unit also got help from various volunteers in increasing outputs & selling its products.



For the first time Ms. Mahalakshmi, Mr. Ravishankar & Mr. Sunil from Rachana, a Skill Development & Livelihood Unit of Seva-in-Action went to New Delhi to attend two days "First National Convention of Self Advocates Forum of India (SAFI)". It was a joint initiative of Parivar, National Trust & CBM South Asia Regional Office, Bangalore to bring Self advocates together to discuss various

issues of persons with intellectual & developmental disabilities ranging from their personal life experiences both positive &negative which they experience in their day-to-day lives and plans to overcome the issues.

The most interesting part of the convention was conducting election to elect candidates for the post of President, Secretary, Treasurer and the National Executive Council of SAFI. It was like other general election process in the country in electing National SAFI office-bearers. Kum. Mahalakshmi from Seva-in-Action was elected as President for National Executive Council of SAFI from Karnataka State. In her presidentship they held their first executive committee meeting and schedule to meet again in January 2014 at Bangalore.

Seva-in-Action signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Amogh Trust in the month of April 2013 to set up & manage a centre for imparting computer skills to the differently abled. At present 15 students with intellectual & developmental disabilities are being imparted computer skills by Amogh at Seva-in-Action premises.

Mr. Nagaraj, in charge of Rachana, a Skill Development & Livelihood Unit of Seva-in-Action, attended the summer camp conducted by KeshavaShishuMandira and imparted the

skill of making paper bag to 60 school going children.

A Stall at Bangalore Santhe

Seva-in-Action was allotted one stall in Bangalore Santhe by Bangalore Metro for persons with disabilities for 2 months and SiA had put up a stall on 8 May'13 under Karnataka State Nodal Agency Centre (SNAC) of National Trust.



Marketing

Besides regular sale at Rachana, Seva-in-Action was invited for exhibition cum sale from at Siemens, Cisco & Phillips

Varieties of paper bags, painted diyas, foot mats & candles made by adults with disabilities were sold.

Developing Rachana as an Enterprise

Rachana is an initiation by SiA in 2008 to bring about the economic empowerment of adults with disabilities. It was envisaged to be managed by adults with disabilities with the support of parents. Now it is time for SiA to transfer the responsibility of managing the unit to the members of Rachana with the support of parent group and to ensure a better & higher income for them to make them economically independent and socially confident and secure.

Objectives of the Project:

- 1. To make the production unit into a profit making business enterprise and thereby turn the disabled members of Kalika and Rachana economically independent, socially confident and secured
- 2. To involve the parents and volunteers more actively in the process
- 3. To ease out the responsibility of SiA staff in the production unit so that they can focus better on vocational training and other projects of the organisation
- 4. To ensure regular and higher income to the Rachana team and also to create job opportunity for many other abled adults



The formation of parents group is under process. It is facilitated by conducting number of meetings and discussing issues involved in developing Rachana as a profit making unit with the parents group. Few enthusiastic parents are visiting other parents group and persons to understand the development in this field so that they can learn from them. However the process has started which will take shape by next year.

Adult group of Rachana organizes skill development for employees in Corporate Companies and Banks

Visit to LSI



On 18 June 2013, Tuesday SiA was invited by CSR team of LSI to demonstrate how to make the ecofriendly paper bags of different sizes. Nine adults with disabilities from Rachana. Skill Development Livelihood Unit of Seva-in-Action visited the LSI and taught the skills of making paper bags to its employees. There 46 employees were who

participated in making paper bags in the morning session and made 150 bags. They completed the half-finished cloth bags by folding & eyeleting them. The employees participated proactively and appreciated the teaching skills of Rachana team. Rachana team was very happy & confident post the demonstration. It was a good learning experience for all.

Visit to L&T – a report by Vinodh Bharadwaj, Volunteer, Youth For Seva (YFS)

Making a paper bag is not everybody's cup of tea and imparting the skills onto a person is an uphill task. This process is complicated and complex when a mentally challenged person has to teach another individual the art of making a paper bag. This is exactly what SIA was set out to do in L&T InfoTech Park, Whitefield on Friday, 26th of July.

Seva in Action (SIA) is a partner-NGO of YFS that runs its own small-scale factory for making hand-made paper bags, door-mats, lamps, etc. that exclusively employs the mentally challenged and physically disabled adults.

At the above mentioned occasion, Sanjana (my co-volunteer at YFS) and I had the privilege of joining the Seva in Action team. We had to play the role of mediators to convey the instructions given by the mentally challenged and physically disabled people of SIA to the L&T volunteers who had turned up to help us make paper bags. The employees were divided into three groups in which the first group had to fold the papers, the second had to glue the paper bags up with card-boards for a sturdy base and the third team to punch holes and insert threads to make handles. We had a good number of employees in the room with very high enthusiasm, keenly communicating with people of SIA and learning from them.

The whole experience was new to us with first of its kind's interaction between the corporate world and the physically/mentally challenged. It also played our part in filling the gap between these two entirely different worlds! We express our heartfelt thanks to L&T for inviting SIA for this interactive session, Mr. VinodhBharadwaj (volunteer, YFS), Mrs VardhaHegde (coordinator, Seva in Action) for making this possible and all the L&T employees and Youth For Seva for this great opportunity!

Visit to Wills Fargo Bank

On 17September2013, SiA was invited by the Wills Fargo Bank as part of the CSR to demonstrate how to make the eco-friendly newspaper bags. Eight adults with disabilities from Rachana, a Skill Development & Livelihood Unit of Seva-in-Actionvisited the bank and taught the skills of making paper bags to its employees. There were 40 employees who participated in paper bag making.

Visit to Yahoo

On 29 September 2013, 10 adults with disabilities from Rachana visited Yahoo, a software company on their invitation and taught the skills of making paper bags to 80 employees in two batches. The Yahoo company gave T Shirts to all 10 adults with disabilities. The employees participated with full enthusiasm and at the end they bought the bags themselves through auctioneering. This process helped them to collect Rs. 25,000& they donated it to Seva-in-Action. This enhanced confidence amongst adults with disabilities from Rachana.

Opportunity for exhibiting talents

On 13 April 2013, 10 adults with disabilities from Rachana participated in one day workshop on 'clay & pottery work' at Rangoli, MG road metro, which was organised for children & adults with disabilities on the eve of World's Disabled Day. They all enjoyed the clay work.

There were 10 adults with disabilities from Rachana who participated in the cultural programme organised by Adamya Chetana Trust during its New Year's celebration on 29& 31December 2013. They performed a group dance and received certificate.

The same team of 10 adults with disabilities from Rachana performed a group dance in "SWAVALAMBAN" /"Composite Awareness Camp" programme at Chowdaiah Memorial Hall on 1March 2014. This was organized by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.

LEISURE/RECREATION

The Adventure Camp

An adventure camp was organised for two days for children & adults with disabilities along with their parents by Seva in Actionon 11-2-2014 and 12-2-2014 at RamadevaraBetta in Ramanagara.It is located 50 km towards Mysore from Bangalore. The students & parents from Amogh along with students & parents from Samvardhana resource centre



joined the camp with a team from Rachana unit of Seva-in-Action. Altogether there were 70 persons who participated in the camp. The overall in charge of organising the camp was Mrs. Varada Hegde, Dy Director of Seva-in-Action. She was supported by Ms. Manjula Nanjundaiah, Executive Director of Seva-in-Action, and Mrs. Radhika from Amogh & Mrs. Vanajakshi Hegde from Samvardhana Resource Centre.

The team started on Tuesday by a bus at around 7:45 am and reached Ramanagara by 10:00 am. After breakfast of chowchow bath (upma & kesaribath) and fresh coffee the entire team followed this plan of action:

Tie and Dye

The instructors showed the students the technique of tie and dye. They had already asked the size of T-Shirt of all the students. The students were given plain white T-shirt which they dipped it in plain water and made it wet. They were then asked to roll it in a manner and put four rubber bands. Usage of the colours of their choice was the



next step to be followed. Students were so excited and almost everyone used all the colours. It took nearly two hours for them to finish this and then the students were asked to put their T-shirt in a plastic cover and write their names on the cover. It had to be left in the cover for a day.

The team had lunch by 2pmand were asked to assemble on the ground by 3pm. Teams were divided into two groups and were assigned to do the "Rope Walk" and the other group to pitch a tent.

Pitching a Tent



People assigned to pitch the tent were then subdivided into 3 groups of 6 each & the groups had a demo on how to pitch a tent.

They were given a tent bundle and were asked to do it by themselves. They found it quite exciting.

Rope walking

Two thick ropes were tied to two trees on either side. The first rope was tied some 8 feet from the ground and second on 4 feet. Students were supposed to hold the top one and walk on the lower one. It was very interesting. The instructors made sure that everyone availed the opportunity to do thetask and those who were



interested were allowed to go more than once on the rope.

These activities were over by around 5pm and then students played cricket for one and half hours. Participants were given time to rest and post which the dinner was served.

Camp Fire



Camp fire was eagerly awaited by students and that was next level of enthusiasm stored for them. All of them went around the fire made by the instructors singing and dancing. Instructors did some acrobats using the fire and entertained the group by fire eating (keeps kerosene in the mouth and spit on a fire stick). Team had a session of Anthakshari & they went to bed by 10:00 PM.

Trekking



The next day morning the team assembled at 7:00 am and went for trekking in the nearby hill called 'Ramadevara Betta'. The students were asked to carry their own back pack with water bottles, camera etc.

Zip Line

The most anticipated Zipline, where on a small hill on the left of it an iron rod was anchored to a big rock and on right side end a thick rope, was tied to a tree. The rope was at around 20 feet from the ground level. A thick belt was tied around the rider and rider had to hang, holding the belt. One had to climb the rock with the help of a rope and then the belt gets



attached to the rope with the help of a hook. The rider has to run down the rock and he will be hanging free in the air for two minutes. Each student did it. Some parents and staff of SiA also did the same. The instructors made sure that everyone had a chance. They took extra effort with students who were scared to do it. Hats off to the instructors for his sincere efforts!

Playing with the 'Poi'



In between students were taught to play a Chinese game called the Poi. It is made up of iron chain attached to a glittering colourful ribbon attached to it. The students were asked to hold it and rotate their hand in unison. We were told that it improves eye hand co-ordination.

- Monitoring & evaluation by Deputy Director, Dept of Women & Child Development, Nodal officer as Director and District officers for Empowerment of Differently Abled & Senior Citizens
- NT ROs are at district level nodal agencies / LLCs.
- Rs 20 lakh for awareness programme
- Rs 50 thousand to each district
 - 25 thousand for campaign
 - 25 thousand for stationary & admin

Director will send the proposal to the state govt for approval. The confirmation result will be communicated to all of us after the election.

Issues of Violence & Sexual Harassment of People with disabilities

It is a reality that persons with disabilities have higher risk of victimization, where intellectual disabilities, are more vulnerable. As these persons may not understand what is happening or do not know how to communicate even though the assault may be from a trusted person. There may be others who may not realize that they are being assaulted so they may not share with anyone about the abuse. They are rarely educated about sexuality issues. Even their reports are not taken seriously due to their disabling conditions and negative attitude of the society. Therefore there is



an urgent need to create mass awareness regarding such issues in the larger society in order to protect them from Violence and Sexual harassment.

The sessions were chaired by Dr. Satish Chandra Girimaji, HOD & Prof. Dept. of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, NIMHANS. The sessions were presented by doctors from Psychiatric Dept, NIMHANS. The topics are:

The facilitators formed the groups for discussion and asked them to present, share about transport facilities inclusive of their opinion about 3% reservation for persons with disabilities. The second day of the election took place for the post of President, Secretary and Treasurer for the National Executive Council of SAFI. 


