#### Foreword

Seva-in-Action's journey of 33 years has been aimed at enabling and empowering persons with disability to be a part of the inclusive growth and development of the society. India has been working towards the goal of inclusive development over the last few years and has developed various policies and schemes in different sectors such as health, education, skill development, livelihood, etc. to achieve its goal. Much progress has already been made to create inclusive spaces for persons with disability, by the government and NGO sector in education, skill development & employment for all disabilities. However, one group that has been left behind are those with intellectual and developmental disabilities the major challenge is adults with intellectual disabilities do not have appropriate opportunities to acquire relevant prevocational and vocational skills which creates disadvantages for seeking jobs. The attitudes and mind sets of the society, parents, specialists and employers add to the challenges. Experience from field and evidence shows that, with the right training, support in the workplace as required, and the right opportunities, and with a supportive ecosystem they can make valued contributions in the workplace and lead a dignified life in the society. This year SiA's focus was on developing a model for skill development and wage employment opportunities showcasing this category of disabled persons can work in the wage employment sector provided appropriate opportunities for skill development is developed and provided.

The organization's philosophy and practice of inclusion in education and employment enabled us to contribute to contribute towards national planning of the scheme for intellectual and developmental disabilities of MSJE,GOI and for the courses in inclusive education. We were a part of the working committee for developing the frame work as a part of the "Inclusive India Initiative" of MSJ&E & National Trust – with the objective of providing a comprehensive services through education, skill development early intervention and employment opportunities for intellectual and developmental disabilities to participate in education skill development and employment opportunities as citizens with equal rights. RCI nominated us for IE committee to develop Inclusive education courses for special educators to implement inclusive practices.

The inclusive learning resources developed for DSERT and UNICEF project was field tested in Ramanagar government school specifically for inclusion of children with disabilities and assisting teachers for developing inclusive teaching and learning at class room level.

Our visit to Ethiopia this year was with "Deaf Development & Information Association(DDIA)" in collaboration with Disability and Development partners of UK for supporting them in adaptation of in adapting the school curriculum in sign language and resource person to the conference.

This year Quizabled the signature event of SiA was conducted in two days with prelims in five zones of Bangalore in partners hip with special schools followed by the final event, with Cricketer Srinath & Kannada Film Actor Mohan as the chief guests for the final event it was an inspiration and motivation for the children.

SiA takes this opportunity to convey our sincere thanks to our funding agency National Trust MSJ&E GOI, LTI Bengaluru for funding QUIZABLED. Our special thanks to Mr Jamshed Daboo, CEO Star Bazaar for providing internship and placement of 2 PWID in Star Bazaar, Koramangla and all our well wishers who to provided us with the support in our journey to achieve the mission. One of the key factor for the organization growth is the motivation and enthusiasm of the SiA team to explore innovative ways of developing services and promoting inclusion and providing pportunities in different spheres of life for person with disability.

#### YEAR AT A GLANCE

**Inclusion in open Wage employment for Adults with Intellectual disabilities : New** initiative of skill development and placement of PWIDDs in retail in collaboration with Star Bazaar and support from All Ladies League Bangalore.

**Developing a Frame Work for inclusion of** Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities (PWIDDs) in mainstream development programmes of GOI. Ruma Banerjee was appointed as a working committee member to develop the frame work for the scheme for PWIDDs for MSJ&E.

First meeting of Central Advisory Board of Disabilities (**CABD**) to implement the **RPwD** Act 2016 was held in Delhi February 2018. Ruma Banerjee from Seva-in-Action participated in that meeting as the NGO member to provide suggestions.

Nominated and participated in the General Council Meeting of Rehabilitation Council of India MSJE,GOI.

**Expansion of SiA's International IE consultancy to another NGO "Deaf Development & Information Association(DDIA)" in Ethiopia.** Ruma Banerjee & Manjula Nanjundaiah provided IE consultancy services to the Deaf Development and Information Association in Addis Ababa, in their "Improving education for the Deaf and hard of hearing in Ethiopia" project on invitation by the Disability & Development Partner(DDP), UK.

Piloting Resource Booklets with Regular Teachers in Ramanagara Block: Resource booklets were piloted in Ramanagara Block through training regular School teachers in creating learning resources for inclusion of teaching CWDs, classroom observation of application and taking their feedback for improving the resources. The workshops were organized in collaboration with RV Education Consortium team to give demonstration classes on facilitating learning with school children, creation of resources and using by teachers in their classrooms.

#### Mission 1000 Campaign

Enable India with DNA launched Mission 1000 (1000 opportunities. 1000 lives. 1000 days) on Aug 4, 2017 along with 25+ Company Leaders, 55+ NGO Leaders including Seva-in-Action and 23 Leaders from Various Associations. Company Leaders (CEOs/VPs/MDs) to create an ecosystem of companies along with NGOs and other stakeholders for the Livelihoods of Developmental, Severe and Multiple Disabilities.

#### Play therapy

Facilitators from Play Therapy International organised 6 weeks of play therapy sessions from 19th Feb'18 to 30th March'18 for the students of Seva-in-Action. The objective was structured, planned and designed play activities to match the individual abilities and helping them work towards fulfilling therapeutic objectives and needs, through music therapy, art therapy, dance and movement therapy and relaxation time to help them connect with their inner self.

## THE QUIZABLED 2017 - Knowledge for All - Special Quiz for children with disabilities

The QUIZABLED is a distinctive annual quiz program, organised exclusively for children with disabilities by Seva-in-Action (SiA) and powered by LTI Bengaluru with support from 4 Edge Quizzing Solutions for the past two years to celebrate International Day of Persons with Disabilities. In order to reach out to more number of children under QUIZABLED, this year the PRELIMS was organised in 7 Nodal centres division wise across Bengaluru and totally 347 children with disabilities participated in the prelims and totally 168 differently abled children & adults participated in the final quiz.

One day workshop on 'The Power of Roles': An orientation to Social Role Valorization(SRV) was organized by Keystone Institute India (KII), New Delhi and Seva-in-Action as one of the course partners in Bengaluru with the objective of introducing participants to the Principles of Social Role Valorization.

One day workshop on 'Real Work, Real Lives, and Real Contribution: An exploration of what "works" in supported employment for people with developmental disabilities' was organized by Keystone Institute India & The Hans Foundation, New Delhi with Seva-in-Action as one of the partners on Supported Employment. The objective of the workshop was discovering and adapting some of the best practices of supported employment into the Indian context.

#### Foundation Day of SiA

The celebration of Foundation Day of SiA was special this year as its Founder Director Mrs. Indumathi Rao and Founder team (old & existing management members & workers) of SiA came together at Seva-in-Action's Auditorium to celebrate its foundation Day. The Chief guest for the day was Dr. B.N Gangadhar, Director of NIMHANS.

**CENTRE** Working towards developing an inclusive society

#### 1. SKILL DEVELOPMENT & LIVELIHOOD

# 1.1 Inclusion of Adults with Intellectual disabilities in open Wage employment - A new initiative by SiA

A new initiative of SiA was training of persons with Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities (PWIDDs) in Retail in collaboration with Star Bazaar with the support of All Ladies League. The process involved the following aspects:-

#### **Sensitization to Parents**

SiA worked with the parents of 10 adults with intellectual disabilities who were selected by SiA for training in open wage employment in the retail space. The parents were taken the responsibility of sending their children / wards with well-groomed and train them to commute independently by public transportation. In the beginning, parents were hesitant and not sure that their children can travel by changing two buses, but gradually they realised that their wards can commute independently.

#### **Training on Personality development – 1st Batch**

SiA trained this group on personal hygiene and self-grooming for a week before placing them in Star Bazaar. They were also sent for an orientation visit to nearby super markets in Koramangala for an observation.



#### On the Job training

SiA placed all 10 trainees in Star Bazaar for one month on

the job training from 5<sup>th</sup> June 2017. They all except one trainee continued for one month regularly with hand hold by Ms. Varada and Ms. Thulasi of SiA with Star Bazaar team.

#### **Interview for Job**

Mr. Albert, Manager and Ms. Jeevitha, HR, Star Bazaar conducted an interview with six short listed trainees on 6th July 2017.



Finally 3 trainees were selected for the job at Star Bazaar i.e. Mahalakshmi, Mr. Ravi Shankar Rao and Mr. Victor Samuel.

They are now proud employees of Star Bazaar and became earning members in their family.

#### Skill development training - 2<sup>nd</sup> Batch of Training

Ms. Thulasi & Ms. Varada Hegde from SiA trained 2<sup>nd</sup> batch 8 students on personal hygiene, self-grooming and specific skills on retail & Food & Beverage for a week. They were placed for an orientation visit to

Nuts corner in Koramangala. We prepared them to place them in Star Bazaar (retail) and Hatti Kappi (F&B) or housekeeping.

#### 2. INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

#### 2.1 Working with the Govt. of India to develop scheme for PWIDD.

The MSJE, GOI had set up a task group to develop a framework for intellectual and developmental disabilities to make sure that this community's needs are met within mainstream service provision across their lifecycle. The objective of the frame work is to develop a scheme which includes different areas across life cycle as early intervention, education, livelihood and advocacy. Ruma Banerjee was a member in developing skill development program for this category for the inclusive frame work

#### **Developing Inclusive Education Course under RCI**

Rehabilitation council for the first time developed 6 months distant learning Advanced Certificate Course in Inclusive Education, Cross Disability to train Special teachers with D.Ed/B.Ed (Any Specialization). Ruma Banerjee was the expert committee member to develop the course curriculum and on line learning materials. The objective of the course is to equip special educators for implementation of in regular schools.

#### 2.2 Workshop on identification & assessment of children with disabilities

Workshop for three days was organized for Education Facilitators & Coordinators from RVEC on May 3-5, 2017 with the following objectives:

- To recognize children with disabilities (CWDs) and their specific needs
- To understand the concept of disability in the context of UNCRPD
- To identify and assess CWDs(functional assessment)
- To comprehend the mapping of developmental checklist from NIMH
- To realize the significance of sensitivity towards children with disabilities and creating inclusive learning environment.
- To understand the significance of collaboration for providing resource support to CWDs

The three days workshop was facilitated by Manjula Nanjundaiah for 9 through Power point



presentations, Interactions, Brain storming, Case studies, Group work & Reflection, Observation of Adults with disabilities in Skills development unit of Seva-in-Action, Hand on experience by assessing children with disabilities with functional assessment guide & kit, Preparing assessment report, Mapping of developmental checklist from NIMH, Watching success stories of persons with disabilities & discussions

on how to do networking with others to support children with disabilities.

**OUTCOME:** The participants were able to understand the concept of disability in the context of NCRPD & RPD Bill 2016; conduct functional assessment of the child with disability assigned to them; prepare assessment report with individual plan for the assessed child; understand the significance of collaboration and networking for effective IE.

At the end of the workshop, 1 set of Functional Assessment tools with guide given to RVEC Resource Centre.



# 2.3 Expansion of SiA's international IE consultancy to another NGO "Deaf Development & Information Association(DDIA)" in Ethiopia.

Ruma Banerjee & Manjula Nanjundaiah extended IE consultancy services to the Deaf Development and Information Association in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia for their project "Improving education for the Deaf and hard of hearing in Ethiopia" after IE Consultancy services to Berhan Lehetsanat since 2013 - 2015 for the Disability & Development Partner(DDP), UK. The first visit to DDIA was from 18th June to 26th June 2017 with the following objectives:

1. To understand the project and its strategies for implementation by visiting Project schools at Addis

3. To participate and share SiA's IE experiences in the three days National Workshop organized by DDIA in collaboration with the Ministry of Education with the financial support of Disability and Development Partner, UK. The participants were teachers, parents and teacher aids across Ethiopia from Addis Abba, and the four regional hubs of Bishoftu (Oromia region), Arba Minch (SNNPR), Dessie (Amhara), and Mekele (Tigray).

#### 2.4 Piloting Resource booklets with regular teachers in Ramanagara Block

The Resource booklets developed by RVEC & Seva-in-Action under the project of Preservice teacher education (DSERT funded by UNICEF) to develop inclusive learning resources (TLM) for regular teachers to support them for inclusive teaching was fielded specifically for CwDs. A total of more than 100 booklets were developed with the **following objectives** at three levels: Level 1 for classes 1 to 3; Level 2 for classes 4 and 5; Level 3 for classes 6 to 8:

• To provide ideas to help create inclusive, learner friendly classrooms.

- The range of resources helps to meet the needs of diverse groups of children, including those from disadvantaged groups and with disabilities.
- The levels can be used across classes, depending on the children's needs. For example if a child of class 7 is not at the expected level in Mathematics, booklet meant for level 2 or level 1 may be used as appropriate.
- The resources have to be created using locally available materials

Though these booklets were piloted in few schools in urban areas there was a need to pilot these resource materials specially in schools where children with disabilities were studying in order to get feedback from teachers regarding its use for classroom teaching which includes children with disabilities. It was decided to organize four one day workshops for school teachers from Ramanagara Block with the objective of piloting Resource booklets for 4 consecutive Saturdays from 20th January 2018 to 10th February 2018 by SiA with RVEC in School Readiness Programme (SRP) Centre of SSA, Ramanagara with the support of BEO Office.

Teachers were oriented through recreating learning resources based on resource booklets, demonstration classes from resource persons from RVEC use it in their classrooms.

#### In between workshops the following things were done:

- Observing teachers' classes for their use of resources and video recording
- Taking feedback from teachers and samples of children's work
- Re-edit the resource booklets

The 1st IE Workshop on 'piloting Resource booklets through teachers' was held on Saturday, 20th January 2018 at SSA's School Readiness Programme (SRP) Centre in Ramanagara.



The workshop was started with the DIET Principal, BEO, BRC & APCs of Ramanagara addressing the participants and motivating them to make best use of the workshop. The DIET Principal invited SiA & RVEC to set up an IE Resource Centre in Ramanagara DIET while addressing the group.

#### INFERENCES FROM PRE & POST WORKSHOP TESTS ON UNDERSTANDING IE

- In the beginning of the workshop the teachers were not sure whether all children can learn, but by the end of the workshop there was confidence that "All children can learn". This shift was observed in the process of the workshop.
- All teachers came with the belief that children with special needs should study with other children, learning space should not be differentiated.
- There was a change in the idea on differentiated planning from making individual plans to the idea that a small change/tweaking in general plan can help to involve all. This was observed during the classroom observations as well.
- Group work and working in pair is an effective way of teaching and learning.
- Use of different types of resources according to the child's *level* would be useful besides few teachers felt that same resource with appropriate modifications keeping in mind the different needs of children can be used.

#### 3. DIRECT SERVICES

#### to reach out rehabilitation services to persons with disabilities(pwds)

SIA has been working in Ramanagara, of Ramanagara Dist & Hoskote, Bengaluru Rural District through resource centres to provide services such as inclusive education, skill development training & livelihood besides supportive systems like medical, counselling and helping pwds & their families to avail government facilities.

The following are the rural and urban centres:

- 1. Samvardhana Resource Centre, Ramanagara
- 2. Seva-in-Action Resource Centre, Hoskote, Bengaluru Rural Dist.
- 3. 'Action For Inclusion' Urban Resource Centre of Seva-in-Action, Koramangala, Bengaluru

#### 3.1. Samvardhana Resource Centre, Ramanagara

The centre is providing direct services to 22 children and adults with disabilities under Preparatory/School Readiness, Inclusive Education & Pre-vocational & Skills Development & livelihood.

This year the following activities were carried out:

- This year adults with disabilities under Skill Development & Livelihood knitted 120 woollen mats along with their parents and SiA sold all 120 mats in Bengaluru and the amount was given to the centre for the payment to the beneficiaries who had knitted the mats.
- Organised a Rangoli competition for the women from surrounding area on the eve of
- Ganesha Chaturthi the Centre. The purpose was to introduce them about the Centre & its activities so that there is community involvement the centre's activities. Totally 15 women participated in the competition and prizes were given to the winners in the function organised after the competition.
- Veena organised awareness programme in the Centre by inviting Dr. Akshay & Dr.
  - Shankar Sharma from NIMHANS to sensitize locals & parents of persons with disabilities on the issues of Health & Health facilities available under the Health Department. There were 50 participants comprising of locals from surrounding area, persons with disabilities, parents and members of the local committee. The impact of the programme was 2 women became member of Seva-in-Action's Ramanagara Committee.
- The Law college of Ramanagara organised a World Mental Health Day in their premises on 8th November 2017 and Children & Adults with disabilities from the Samvardhana Resource Centre took part in that programme by singing a prayer.



- SSA organised sports on the eve of International Day of Persons with Disabilities were 27 children with disabilities from the Centre participated in the district sports. Out of 27 children, 12 children won the 1st & 2nd Places. They also exhibited Yoga in the cultural programme.
- There were 2 children with intellectual disability & two children with hearing impairment who participated in the special quiz 'The Quizabled 2017- Knowledge for All' organised by Seva-in-Action in Bengaluru.

   The Lion's Club (Women members) of Ramanagara organised the Sports in



Samvardhana Resource Centre's premises for children with disabilities and totally 24 children (19 children from Samvardahana Centre & 5 children form Vyshnavi Education Trust) also participated along with the parents. Prize was given to all children.

• The Annual day of the Samvardhana Resource Centre(SRC) was celebrated on 6th

February 2018 at the centre children & adults with disabilities, parents, local committee members & Govt School teachers participated in the programme. Smt Varada Hegde, participated in the Annual day celebration and shared about the activities of SiA. The donors were felicitated by SRC to recognise their contribution to the Centre.



• The resource teacher worked with SiA in organising 4 days IE Workshop for teachers every Saturday.

#### The Resource teacher with local committee members mobilized the following:

- The ramp was built for Samvardhana Resource Centre with the financial support from Smt. Vanajamma, Retd HM, Ramanagara & Shri. Badrinath, Bengaluru
- The Teaching materials purchased for the Centre with the support of Mr. Badarinath, Social Worker, Bengaluru
- The free auditing service to the centre is being done from past 6 years by Sri. Mohammed Khizar Qureshi, Auditor

#### 3.2. Seva-in-Action Resource Centre, Hoskote

The centre is providing direct services to 19 beneficiaries under Skills Development training & livelihood.

This year the following activities were carried out:

- The teacher along with children & adults with disabilities from Hoskote Centre participated in the public function organised on at High School Stadium, Hoskote on the eve of Independence day.
- Children with disabilities from the Centre & their parents celebrated Teachers' Day at the Centre on 5th September 2017 and one of the parents gave a small gift to the both teacher & Asst teacher and sweets to everyone.
- 2 children with disabilities from the Centre got their disability Card.
- The teacher organised physiotherapy sessions for 3 children at the Centre twice a week for 1 month by the Physiotherapist from BRC, Hoskote.

 Mobilised 50 Kg Candle making Wax & used cloths to make foot mats from 'AshtaShakti' Trust, Bengaluru for Skill development of adults with disabilities & production in the Centre.



Children & their parents participated in the different competitions organised by the Education Department on the eve of **International Day of Persons with Disabilities in Hoskote**. In this competition, 2 children won prizes in drawing competition; 1 child in singing; 3 children in Fancy dress & one child in Sports. Parents also participated in the sports and 3 parents won the prizes.

# 3.3. 'Action For Inclusion' – Urban Resource Centre of Seva-in-Action, Koramangala, Bengaluru

#### Pre-Vocational & SKill Development Trg Unit for Persons with disabilities

The main objective of this unit is imparting Pre-vocation skills and providing training to persons with disabilities in specific job skills towards their economic empowerment.

Rachana, a production unit - The different types of paper bags, candles and bead jewellery are made in this unit. This unit also gets help from various volunteers (college students, home makers, etc.) in enhancing the production & selling its products.

#### THE ACTIVITIES & PROGRAMMES CONDUCTED FOR 2017-18 AT SiA:

#### Play therapy

Facilitators from Play Therapy International organised 6 weeks of play therapy sessions from



19th Feb'18 to 30th March'18 for the students of Seva-in-Action. All the students got divided into groups A, B and C. These groups were structured, planned and designed to match the individual abilities and helping

them work towards fulfilling therapeutic objectives and needs. The sessions included activities from Music therapy, art therapy, dance and movement therapy and relaxation time to help them connect with their inner self. The activities conducted in these sessions focussed on creative self expression to support the participant's emotional regulation and balance. These activities helped in improving the student's interpersonal skills, self-confidence, social skills and the ability to participate and work with groups to experience the joy of connection.

The interventions helped with the adaptive behaviours of the students and in reducing their

challenging behaviours.

Workshop on making paper bags from Adults with disabilities Students conducted a workshop on 4th July 2017 on how to make paper bags and taught students of Voice of Needy, an NGO located in Mahalakshmipuram, Bengaluru.

Many students from different colleges such as Christ, Jyoti Niwas, New Horizon, Mt. Carmel, etc. had







# 6.1 One day workshop on 'The power of roles': an orientation to Social Role Valorization(SRV)

Seva-in-Action was one of the Course partners with Keystone Institute India (KII), New Delhi & Bubbles Centre for Autism, Bengaluru of the SRV Workshop held on Tuesday, 23rd May 2017 at Lemon Tree Hotel, Electronic City, Bangalore. The sponsoring partners were The Hans Foundation (THF) & National Trust (NT). The SRV graduates Ms. Manjula Nanjundaiah &





Mrs. Thulasi from Seva-in-Action had an opportunity to act as the co-faculty in the workshop with Mrs. Elizabeth Neuville (Main faculty) from Keystone Institute India, New Delhi. The total number of participants in the workshop were around 30 & they were all represented different organisations in Bangalore and 2 persons participated from Mysuru & Mandya.

It was a brief but intensive one day training course which introduced participants to the Principles of Social Role Valorization. The SRV principles explore the common life experiences, or wounds, of people living on the margins of society, or who have been outright abandoned and rejected, and the impacts of these wounds on individual people and on society.

The theme of the Workshop 'The Power of Roles' was derived from SRV Theory which is the successor to Normalization, and is based on the work of Dr. Wolf Wolfensberger. This was a investment significant the development of disability leadership. The course had lengthy presentations by Mrs. Elizabeth

# 6.2 One day workshop on 'real work, real lives, and real contribution: An exploration of what "works" in supported employment for people with developmental disabilities'

Seva-in-Action was again one of the partners with Keystone Institute India & The Hans Foundation, New Delhi in organising one day workshop on Supported Employment in McGrath Grand Hotel, Bangalore along with Bubbles Centre for Autism and Shristi Special Academy on Tuesday, 3rd April 2018. The total number of participants were around 30.

The objective of the workshop was discovering and adapting some of the best practices of supported employment into the Indian context. Employment has largely been unavailable to people with significant intellectual & developmental disabilities. New ideas and new thinking were helping participants learn to make room for people with disability in the workforce.

The international experts & Leaders in inclusion, Milton Tyree and Hope Dittmeier shared their work on the following points through power point presentation on supported employment for persons with intellectual & developmental disabilities and discussed some of the successful strategies and methods for inclusive work, with a dialogue about ways and means to adapt to the context each of the participant are working in.

- RE-THINKING "READINESS" (Service Evolution) USING DISCOVERY (devoting time to know the job seeker) rather than "job readiness" or arbitrary "job placement" Always needs a "job coach"; Discovering Fitting Opportunities CONTRIBUTIONS (what the person has to offer others, contribute to community), INTERESTS (What the person prefers or wants: Look for interests that are typical for age, gender, and culture that are the most highly valued), CONDITIONS (What helps the person do their best work How do we identify and structure opportunities that are most likely to result in the person experiencing success?)
- Customized Employment Negotiating Mutual Benefit (Matching Employer Needs with job seeker contribution)
- Best and Better Options: Weighing implications for image and competency enhancement (evolving understanding of support - natural supports). Understanding and Honouring the Typical and the Valued
- Building Capacity: Employment Roles and Responsibilities

The participants were actively involved in the dialogue with the Resource persons to



understand the new & powerful ideas principles through real cases that can assist people with disabilities to enjoy all the benefits of authentic work roles. #### **About Seva-in-Action (SiA)**

Seva-in-Action (SiA), a voluntary organization was established in the year 1985, with the mission of empowering persons with disabilities and create equitable opportunities for an inclusive society. Realizing wide gap between the services available and services needed, SiA set out with identifying and reaching out rehabilitation programme for children with disabilities (cwds) working very closely with local communities to develop and implement socially, culturally and economically appropriate services with holistic approach. The entire programme is based on demystifying and transferring technology in simple and relevant terms at community level. SIA essentially works through the local committees and families of children with disabilities at the local levels in rural areas of Karnataka. Initially the support came from funding agencies such as Action Aid, UNICEF, Norad, DANIDA besides the state govt and govt of India for developing services in the field of CBR and capacity building of the education system and teacher education programmes. SiA received financial support from the Target India for 2 years to implement its activities from 2008-2010.

SIA's is focusing its work in the context of related educational structures that determine the development, individual growth of cwds and their right to education. Mainstreaming person with disabilities, thereby enabling them to lead a life of confidence and dignity to this end SIA has been very closely working with the state and central government to plan and develop policies for Persons with Disabilities (pwds). Seva-in-action has consultative status for Ministry of Human Resource & Development (MHRD) GOI and Primary & Secondary Education, Govt. of Karnataka for implementing inclusive education besides conducting action research and evaluation of inclusive education programs. SiA was also the state nodal agency centre (SNAC) for National Trust MSJ&E, GOI from July 2010 to July 2017.

From last two years, SiA is being received the one time financial support from the LTI Bengaluru for its annual event of Quizabled.

The Quizabled is a distinctive annual event where a special quiz competition conducted exclusively for children with disabilities from special schools and mainstream schools. It provides a platform for children with disabilities to showcase their knowledge & intellectual capabilities.

#### **AREAS OF WORK:**

SiA works through the following pronged approach:-

- 1. Community Based Activities (CBA) Education, Skills Development & Livelihood for children & adults with disabilities through Resource Centres in Koramangala, Ramanagara and Hoskote
- 2. Research, Training & Resource Development for Inclusive Education
- 3. Working with the Govt. System SiA was a State Nodal Agency Centre of National Trust Karnataka from June 2010 to July 2017. Since 2016 SiA has been running the Information Centre at State level in the premises of NIMHANS in collaboration with the Department of Differently abled & Senior Citizens & NIMHANS.
- 4. International Consultancy for organization working in the area of Inclusive education

Seva-in-Action (SiA) is a voluntary organisation founded in 1985, with the goal to empower persons & families with disabilities and promote inclusion and ensure their human rights through Community Based Rehabilitation & Inclusive Education. It cradles the vision of developing egalitarian society. SiA started with the skill development and livelihood program in urban area in 2010 when the adults with intellectual disabilities were out from special schools and the parents did not know how to help them in getting open wage employment or engage them with meaningful livelihood opportunities.

Training & Employment is most important because having a skills & job enhances social status and provides wages. It increases integration of contacts and opportunities for other integrated activities. Adult with Disabilities will become productive members in the family and it increases their self esteem & promotes individual growth. People with intellectual disabilities should be taught skills in the environment in which they are going to be used i.e. on the job.

In this context, SiA is looking for adult with disabilities who required skill training and placement in the areas of Retail, Hospitality and Computer. Subsequently, the Adults are placed in the suitable training for the placement. SiA will assist in the initial stages of training.
