Foreword

Seva-in-Action (SiA) completes 35 years in the field of disability an important milestone in the journey of the organization. Global impact in the lives of mankind was massive due to the Pandemic caused by Corona virus. Though this has changed the lives of individuals world-wide, the major impact has been on the socio economically disadvantaged groups of which persons with disabilities are a part. Families of children & adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities had a major challenge managing their children at home. Though SiA had to close down its centre from March end and discontinue its face to face activities but the support to families continued through digital and telephonic method. SiAprovided support to families of children with disabilities and other NGOs by counselling skill development besides providing with groceries and medicines and staff of SiA.

Effective transition from school education to skill development is imperative in the life of persons with disabilities. Hence skill development to access livelihood opportunities in government, private through wage employment and self-employment has become the need of the hour. In order to prepare children for skill development it become sessential to develop Standardized Prevocational Education (Training) curriculum for cross disability and specifically for Persons with Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities (PWIDDs). In this context SiA in collaboration with NIEPMD, Chennai had a workshop on developing Pre-Vocational Curriculum across disabilities.


In collaboration with Enable India, Seva-in-Action (SiA) selected few of the trainees from Skill development unit for training in Employability in Food & Beverages Services (Hospitality) Digitalization and Car Washing.

International and National consultancy in Inclusive Education (IE) was made by Manjula Nanjundaiah and myself. We visited Ethiopia, but the situation was not amiable due to civil conflict in the country. Hence, we organised workshop for Teacher assistants in IE besides developing Sign Language Anthem of Ethiopia. Consultancy was done with Rural Development Trust, Ananthpur, in developing their special schools to inclusive schools.

It was 5th year of Quizabled a distinctive and annual event of SiA. This year Quizabled chapter was launched in Mumbai in collaboration with Sujaya Foundation besides organizing in Bangalore and Chennai with SPASTN. Quizabled was extended to five Districts of Karnataka and to 5 other Districts of Tamil Nadu.

SiA is extremely thankful to our donors, National Trust (MSJE GOI) for supporting our prevocational training unit. Our sincere gratitude to LTI for providing continuous support to Quizabled and extending to other cities and districts. Our sincere thanks to Bharat Kalyan Pratishtan for their continuous support to rural project. SiA is extremely thankful to its volunteers and others who have supported us to achieve the objectives of the organization. Commitment and relent less work of SiA team for the development of persons with disabilities has enabled the organization to achieve this significant mile stone for which the organization is forever thankful.

ACTION FOR INCLUSION – BENGALURU RESOURCE CENTRE Working towards developing an inclusive society

- 1. PRE-VOCATION, SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING & LIVELIHOOD FOR PWIDDs
- **1.1** SiA in collaboration with NIEPMD, Chennai organized a workshop on developing Pre-Vocational Curriculum across disabilities.

Development of Pre-Vocational Curriculum for Persons with Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities (PWIDDs) is essential looking into the prevalence of adult with intellectual disabilities and the need for accessing livelihood opportunities. Effective transition from special /regular school education to skill development is imperative in the life of persons with disabilities. In order to prepare children for skill development it becomes essential to develop Standardized Prevocational Education (Training) curriculum for cross disability and specifically for Persons with Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities (PWIDDs).

Thus, SiA in collaboration with NIEPMD organized two days' workshop on "Developing and Standardization of Prevocational Education (Training) curriculum for cross disability and diversity. This workshop had participants from NIEPMD prevocational & Skill Development unit, besides representative from NIEPID, Secunderabad, few NGOs working with persons with intellectual & developmental disabilities from Bengaluru, Hyderabad & Chennai besides Ruma Banerjee, Manjula Nanjundaiah & Varada Hegde from SiA and Mrs. Maria Santamaria from Diya Foundation from Bengaluru.Ruma Banerjee shared the experience of SiA's Prevocational training and expressed the need for developing a curriculum. It was suggested that curriculum should be developed at 3 levels - 1. Basics 2. Intermediate 3. Advanced. Age group should be 14 years to 17 years and duration of the course to be 3 years. Secondly to ensure the Govt Scheme for Pre-vocational curriculum & its implementation by Special School, NGOs & Regular Schools also.

1.2 Skill Development and Employability training under Mission 1000

In collaboration with Enable India, Seva-in-Action (SiA) selected 5 Students with intellectual and developmental disabilities (SWIDDs) for Skill Development and Employability training in the following domains:



Mr. Girish and Ms. Rakshitha from Seva-in-Action with selected candidates of SiA had exposure visit to companies - DELL EMC, Allegis & Hattikaapi which had been organised by the Enable India for NGOs to understand & analyse the job along with the candidates.

The training started with the candidates from June 2019

Preparation of Learning Resources

Developed innovative the teaching and learning materials for Safety Touch, Follow the rules, Leg & Hand tracking, General Knowledge album, Communication & process steps for House Keeping & Retail activities etc.

Developing Work Environment Area

Created F & B(Food & Beverage) Lab, Housekeeping Lab & Model Shop for training in SiA premises.

1.3 Internship of SWIDDs from SiA's Skill development training unit in Companies

There were two students went to Hatti Kaapi and 1 student went to EY-Sodexo for 1-month internship in House Keeping; one student went to Allegis for internship in Car Washing, and another three students went to different NGOs for internship in Digitization. The job coaching & sensitization happened in Hatti Kaapi EY-Sodexo. Two students who had completed their internship in EY-Sodexo and Allegis got stipend of Rs. 2000 from the respective companies.

Placement

Two students got job as permanent employees - one in Hattikaapi & one in RNS College under House Keeping Domain and 2 other students were placed in Retail sector.

1.4 Parents' Workshop

SiA organised &conducted the following Parents' Workshops in its premises: Workshop for parents of SiA students was held on 26th June 2019 on the topic "Importance of skill and the role of parents" which had over 32 participants. Parents from Raichur and Kalaburagi were also participated.





Conducted a parents' workshop on 18th January 2020. Dr. Sivakumar of NIMHANS, Bengaluru had interaction with parents on the subject "Adolescence Issues in PWDs" in prelunch session. Ms. Priya had motivational speech & interaction session with parents in post-lunch session.

iBAT – Inclusive Beyond Ability Trust along with Art of Living volunteers conducted activities like Yoga, Meditation on 12th March 2020 for SiA staff, students and their parents from 11.00 am to 1.00 pm and from 2.00 pm to 4.00 pm Ms. Vandana had interaction with parents on Mind Power.



Supporting Families with employment-Supported the family economy by providing the job to parents in different areas where they can work. As such we provided jobs for 4 family members & students in Microsoft, Home Maid & other sectors

2. INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

2.1 Central Advisory Board Meeting

Ruma Banerjee attended the 3rd Central Advisory Board for Disabilities (CABD) meeting at Delhi which is chaired by the Honourable Minister of Social Justice. She had the opportunity to speak regarding collaboration with MHRD to implement IE and to align the RTE Act with RPD Act for ensuring the right to education.

2.2 SiA's National & International IE Consultancy Work

2.2.1 IE Consultation with RDT, Ananthpur, Andhra Pradesh

RDT team visited Seva-in-Action (SiA)

RDT team comprising of Mr. Dasarath & Ms. Zulekha along with Mr. Thippanna from SACRED and Mr. Venkatesh Balakrishna (Venki) from AVHV visited SiA on 23rd August 2019 regarding the prospect of Seva-in-Action (SiA) helping RDT and SACRED to promote and strengthen IE in Anantapur district. During the meeting experiences SiA developing IE was shared. Later Ruma & Manjula made 2 days visit to RDT & SACRED from 21st to 23rd October 2019 to observe and understanding their activities and to provide with necessary support.

During the two days' visit to RDT the following takenup: - Visits to

- RDT campus to understand the functions
- High School & Primary School for Inclusive Education,
- Bukkarayasamudram Center for children with Intellectual disabilities, Primary school
- Kudair Center for children with cerebral palsy, Visit handicrafts center of women with Disabilities
- Discussions with the RDT team to decide the roles of RDT &SiA Resource Development at RDT for Inclusive Education.

Action points with Time frame was shared by Mr Dasarath with SiA team gave its reflections on the action points and asked RDT to make the TOR.

The following work done by RDT IE technical team in consultation with SiAIE team

- The RDT IE technical team (Yugandhar and Zulekha) with the ground work done
 visited SiA and had a discussion with Manjula Nanjundaiah on 6th February 2020 &
 finetuned the points made by RDT IE team required for better functioning of
 Resource Rooms so that all Primary Inclusive schools at RDT follow a uniform
 method in running Resource rooms effectively.
- All the three had a brain storm on "Our Understanding about Learning resources"
 Which was followed by a presentation by Ms. Manjula on Learning Resources and
 how to categorize them.
- It was decided that RDT IE Team will make a list on Learning Resources required for a
 Resource Room with Teachers from schools and share with SiA for categorization
 when RDT IE team meet SiA in the 2nd week of April 2020 to finalize the Curriculum
 for Resource Teachers' Training (ToT).
- 1st draft of the Curriculum on Inclusive Education developed by RDT IE technical team for training of selected teachers in RDT and shared the same to SiA team for their feedback. The feedback was given to RDT on the curriculum by Ruma Banerjee and Manjula Nanjundaiah it was ready for finalisation.
- SiA IE team shared the learning materials on IE to RDT IE technical team and they
 are working on the materials required for the training of teachers in IE based on the
 curriculum.

2.2.2 SiA's International IE Consultancy work with "The Deaf Development & Information Association (DDIA)" in Ethiopia.

The third Inclusive Education consultancy visit for DDIA at Addis Ababa in Ethiopia for the Disability & Development Partner's (DDP's) project "Improving Education for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing in Ethiopia was done by Ms. Manjula Nanjundaiah and Mrs. Ruma Banerjee from 19th to 28th June 2019 with the following objectives:

Visit to Merawi Primary School near Bahir dar, Amhara Regional State, 1. to understand the impact of the project by meeting with the School Director, students with hard of hearing & deaf and their parents.

- 2 . Assessment of Teacher Assistants (TAs) in terms of their competencies.
- Feedback and reflection of TA about the project in terms of achieving its objectives and implementation.
- 4. Understand parent's perspective regarding continuing with the education of deaf & hard of hearing students.
- 5. Developing Ethiopian National Anthem in Sign language for awareness creation and producing a professional video.
- 6. Assisting TAs to develop future plan for completing the tasks pending for the extension period.

Mr. Vasanth and Mr. Sandesh, Founders of VS International Pre-School Visited Seva-in-Action on 9th July 2019 to discuss regarding Inclusive Education & NIOS. They also visited Skill Development training & production unit of SiA.

The efforts of SiA in training of adults with disabilities in creating different products impressed them immensely. They invited Seva-in-Action to put up a stall at their School during "Rhymes Workshop" organised for their parents in July. Team from SiA comprising of Kalavathi, regular volunteer, Rakshitha, teacher and Mohammad Adnan, trainee Skill development unit set up a stall in theirschool. The school management arranged for transportation and other logistics support for the stall at their school premises. They even collected used cloths from their parents for SiA for making bags. The school provided with extensive support for enormous sales of the products also.

2.4 Visit and support to Chetna Centre, Vijaypura Himachal Pradesh.

3 days-Excursion to Puducherry





PRELIMINARY ROUND - IN 5 DISTRICTS OF KARNATAKA


The PRELIMS were conducted on 6th Nov 2019 in the following nodal centres of 5 Districts of Karnataka viz., Mysuru, Davanagere, Dharwada, Gadaga, and Kalaburagi. Totally, 228 children participated from 22 special schools for Blind and Deaf Children.

This year besides the printed questionnaires, SiA also got questionnaires for Group C printed in Braille from the Braille Press of Mithra Jyothi, Bengaluru and made these available to the teams of Blind students. The children were very independent and confident while using the Braille question paper. One team of Group C & one team of Group D from each District qualified for the Finals.

IN BENGALURU EDITION - The PRELIMS were conducted on 13th Nov 2019 in the following 7 Nodal centres across Bengaluru. Totally, 350 students with Disabilities participated from 33 special schools across Bengaluru.



Out of 350 children, 170 Children were qualified for Quarter final from Group A & 36 children from Group B, C & D respectively were qualified for the FINALS. The Participation certificates were awarded to all the participants in the PRELIMs.

FINAL EVENT

The Final event of 5th Bengaluru edition of the Quizabled 2019 was organised on Saturday, 23rd November 2019 at Indoor stadium in BMS College of Engineering, Bengaluru.

The Preliminary and finals were conducted on the same day.


The students were categorised in the following three groups:



Quizabled: Knowledge for all Special quiz for children with disabilities

2016 - 2019

Quizabled is a unique and special quiz competition exclusively for children with disabilities. It is conducted with the support of '1 Step – a CSR initiative of Larsen & Toubro Infotech (LTI) Bengaluru, along with quizzing partners 4 Edge Quizzing Solutions, Mindcogs, Catalyst Quiz Corp and Quriosity Knowledge solutions.

Conceptualized by Seva-in-Action in partnership with 4 Edge Quizzing Solutions, this quiz is first of its kind in India, where differently-abled participants (cross-disability) are given an opportunity to showcase their knowledge and intellectual capabilities.

The first edition of Quizabled was quite a challenge. The questions were formulated after a lot of research, visits to special schools, observing the children and discussing with special educators. The first edition witnessed framing appropriate questions considering the intellectual abilities of autistic and intellectually disabled children. The insights from the first edition gave rise to a separate category in the quiz for children with intellectual disability.

Over the first five years, Quizabled evolved from a one-day event in Bengaluru to a two-day event across Karnataka and other states. The 5th edition of Quizabled was held at 5 other districts of Karnataka alongside Bengaluru, at Chennai in collaboration with SPATN, Tamil Nadu and at Mumbai in collaboration with Sujaya Foundation, Maharashtra. quizabled reached more than 2000 children and adults in different categories as Intellectual Disability (ID), Cerebral Palsy (CP), Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), Visual Impairment (VI), and Hearing Impairment (HI).
