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Foreword

Seva-in-Action (SiA) completes 35 years in the field of disability an important milestone in the journey of the organization. Global impact in the lives of mankind was massive due to the Pandemic caused by Corona virus. Though this has changed the lives of individuals world-wide, the major impact has been on the socio economically disadvantaged groups of which persons with disabilities are a part. Families of children & adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities had a major challenge managing their children at home. Though SiA had to close down its centre from March end and discontinue its face-to-face activities but the support to families continued through digital and telephonic method. SiA provided support to families of children with disabilities and other NGOs by counselling skill development besides providing with groceries and medicines and staff of SiA.

Effective transition from school education to skill development is imperative in the life of persons with disabilities. Hence skill development to access livelihood opportunities in government, private through wage employment and self-employment has become the need of the hour. In order to prepare children for skill development it becomes essential to develop Standardized Prevocational Education (Training) curriculum for cross disability and specifically for Persons with Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities (PWIDDs). In this context SiA in collaboration with NIEPMD, Chennai had a workshop on developing Pre-Vocational Curriculum across disabilities.

In collaboration with Enable India, Seva-in-Action (SiA) selected few of the trainees from Skill development unit for training in Employability in Food & Beverages Services (Hospitality) Digitalization and Car Washing.

International and National consultancy in Inclusive Education (IE) was made by Manjula Nanjundaiah and myself. We visited Ethiopia, but the situation was not amiable due to civil conflict in the country. Hence, we organised workshop for Teacher assistants in IE besides developing Sign Language Anthem of Ethiopia. Consultancy was done with Rural Development Trust, Ananthpur, in developing their special schools to inclusive schools.

It was 5th year of Quizabled a distinctive and annual event of SiA. This year Quizabled chapter was launched in Mumbai in collaboration with Sujaya Foundation besides organizing in Bangalore and Chennai with SPASTN. Quizabled was extended to five Districts of Karnataka and to 5 other Districts of Tamil Nadu.

SiA is extremely thankful to our donors, National Trust (MSJE GOI) for supporting our prevocational training unit. Our sincere gratitude to LTI for providing continuous support to Quizabled and extending to other cities and districts. Our sincere thanks to Bharat Kalyan Pratishtana for their continuous support to rural project. Commitment and relent less work of SiA team for the development of persons with disabilities has enabled the organization to achieve this significant milestone for which the organization is forever thankful.

1. ACTION FOR INLUSION – BENGALURU RESOURCE CENTER

1.1PRE-VOCATION, SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRG & LIVELIHOOD FOR PWIDDS







While necessary assessments and modifications in the program curriculum were made, a systematic approach was initiated to ensure continuity in skill development and training of PwDs. Communi cations were made through phonecalls, WhatsApp and eventually on the widely accessible Zoom Portal. Parents were given necessary guidance and support to make use of the digital platforms. To ensure virtual training of students with Intellectual & developmental disabilities (PWIDDs) in the Pre-Vocational category, inclusive learning/training materials (25 no of video clips &training resources on Daily Living Activities &safety measures) were shared. Alternatively, classes on communication, Mandala Art, drawing, yoga, music & dance were conducted virtually.

1.2 ANOTHER STEPTOWARDS ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

A total number of ten students with intellectual & developmental disabilities successfully completed **training program on 'Digitization'** under the MISSION 1000 program of Enable India & SAKSHAM CSR Project. The work involves converting PDF files to audible books which is to be used by persons with visual impairment. Currently, seven students are working under the program and are also being paid a stipend.

Seva-in-Action has also placed three of its students with the Multinational Company 'Thomson Reuters' on a paid internship program and two of its students were placed in housekeeping domain.



1.3 NOMINATED FOR PROJECT DISCOVERY AWARD:

SiA participated in Project Discovery, a pan-India video contest that aims to create and collect creative solutions designed for PwDs for everyday challenges. *SiA was nominated for the award* for contributing to this community driven project. A total number of eight video clips on '*Developing simple adaptations in skill training program for persons with intellectual disabilities*' created by SiA were selected and nominated for the award. The video clips showcase simple solutions for day to day problems faced by persons with intellectual disabilities thus helping create a barrier-free environment.

30 different NGOs across India participated in the competition.

AWARENESS PROGRAMS THROUGH RADIO

Manjula Nanjundaiah was invited as a Resource speaker for the Urban Community Radio program, 'NammaVaani' on Radio Active 90.4 MHz. The special series focused ongenerating awareness and sensitizing people on Mental Health Management, Virtual Learning, and Management of PwDsduring/post Lockdown. AWARENESS & ADVOCACY ON PROTECTION OF PWD DURING NATIONWIDE LOCKDOWN

Disability Inclusive Guidelines from the GOI was translated into Kannada & shared with the Karnataka State Chief Secretaries.

An easy -to- read, 4 page flyer was designed with support of Mr. Girish from Seva-in-Action.

The Inclusive Guidelines Flyer in Kannada was cirulated and shared with the State Commissioner for Disabilities, Karnataka, the SPD of Samagra Shikshana Karnataka, with parents groups, NGOs, DDWOs for creating awareness.

An official letter from Seva-in-Action was sent to the State Principal Secretary of WCD, Primary & Secondary Education requesting immediate implemention of the guidelines on priority. A copy of the translated guildlines were attached for reference.

- 1. A job description for Physiotherapists & BIERTs who are a part of 'SamagraShikshana' Karnataka.
- 2. An assessment format to assess physiotherapy needs in children with disabilities
- 3. A weekly & monthly schedule for Physiotherapists

2.5 Research Study on Inclusive Education Resource Teacher's (IERTs) perspective on Diversity


Manjula Nanjundaiah worked as a co-researcher along with Ms.Brinda Raoon on a study conducted by Prof. Mythili from the Tata Institute of Social Science, Mumbai. The aim of the study was to understand the role of IERTs & BRCs in Inclusive Education, in order to design courses for teacher preparation and for inclusion based on the recommendations of the National Policy on Education (NEP), 2020.


The study was conducted to elicit Inclusive Education Resource Teacher's (IERTs)perspective on Diversity, difficulties faced, curricular adaptations & training needs. This was accomplished through focused group discussions, (FGD) virtually& through telephonic interviews with IERTs from Tumkur(TumkurDist), Bagepalli(ChikballapurDist) & Srirangapatna (MandyaDist).


3. SURVEY ON THE IMPACT OF PANDEMIC AND COPING OF FAMILIES


An online survey was conducted by Seva-in-Actionon 'the impact of covid-19 pandemic and coping of families' through the questionnaire method. The survey focused on collecting data on: Access to basic requirements and economic condition during the lockdown crisis, safety measures adopted by PwDs, possibility ofrunning small businesses from home, expectations from parents in terms of conducting activities by SiA. The participants were families of the PwDs and children /adults with disabilities. A total number of 86 participants responded to the survey. We continue to keep a track on the mental health of the PwDs during the crisis situation, ask questions and compare data in the months to come.


















GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF DATA





3.1Eye Opening findings and survey results:

Our online survey results reveal that the Lockdown period during the Pandemic was the toughestphase. Our findings suggest rising levels of distress and negative psychological impacts on the family members. One of the aims of the study was also to observe the economic impact of the lockdown. A total of 47% of therespondents facedmonetary difficulties in particular due to losses in businesses and employment. Many faced difficulties in accessing basic essential goods such as food & medicine. Access to medicines was difficult mainly due to travel restrictions.

But on a brighter note, factors associated with safety measures and guidelines of Covid-19 saw higher percentile of respondents adhering to the norms, just as higher satisfactionlevel was found while attending virtual classes and opting to adopt own strategies for ADL. A majority of the respondentswere found to be considering starting/running a small business from home aiming towards self-employment.

4. CONTINUITY OF REHABILITATION PROGRAMS DURING THE PANDEMIC

With unpredictable challenges emerging ever since the announcement of lockdown, new Operational Strategies were adopted by Seva-in-Action, following all safety protocols issued by the GOI. The Center was closed from end of March 2020, till date. For the first time ever, SiA decided to switch to a complete digital platform. While all ongoing activities held physically at the center were suspended, core activities were resumed and launched on a virtual mode.



All our staff, trainees and parents were addressed and conveyed the need to make the transition. With several changes occurring; this transition phase was a testing period especially for the teachers as they had to ensure the continuity in training of PwDs by adapting to the unique demands of the virtual world. Challenges were also combined with reluctance from parents to switch to the digital mode. Families of children & adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities also faced major challenges in managing their wardsat home.

Nevertheless, we successfully managed to resume and proceed with all our core activities and training for the differently-abled, during this phase. With continuous support and engagement with all trainees and parents, we were able to tackle multiple challenges. Trainers from SiA were constantly in touch with parents and addressed all concerns and queries on a one-on-one basis. Parents were in-turn asked for regular updates about progress of their wards and were also trained to use the Digital Apps and smartphones effectively.

4.2 RESOURCE CENTERS OF SEVA IN ACTION

The Resource teachers at all three centers located in Rural Bengaluru and Urban Bengaluru, were entailed with the responsibility of ensuring continuity of Learning &Interaction by reaching out to all parents/wards.

Virtual and telephonic support covered all ongoing programs of "Early intervention, Special Education, Pre-vocational training, Skill development and Livelihood programs".


The main aim was to ensure impactful learning experiences and identify/overcome developmental delays in infants and children. A total number of 84 beneficiaries with disabilities (infants, children & young adults) were enrolled this year in the resource centers. Further assistance on availing UDID Card, self-employment loan, Niramaya Health Insurance (u/a National Trust)-Registration & renewals were accomplished with support from the Central Office, Seva-in-Action.

PICTURES DEPICTING DISTRIBUTION OF GROCERY KITS AND MEDICINES




The Resource Centers were also provided with materials by SiA (through LTI Catalyst Fund) for setting up of Retail & F&B labs with the aim of imparting housekeeping skills to youths with disabilities. The project is currently on hold due to the result of the Covid-19 crisis and SiA looks at relaunching the program during a feasible situation.

4.4 VIRTUAL CLASSES THROUGH RESOURCE CENTERS

Alongside classes being conducted online, SiA also ensured to hold national/Regional Themed celebrations virtually for beneficiaries in all three Resource Centers. This also included the beneficiaries of the 'Vikas Day Care Center' an initiative of SiA (under the VIKAS SCHEME of National Trust), which is a Day-Program center for providing training to the adults with disabilities in pre-vocational and skill development. They were handed out smartphones as a part of the scheme and this enabled them to attend online classes conducted by Seva-in-Action.

1. MANDALAART

SiA, in collaboration with 'The Gift Garage' organized a series of sessions on Mandala making with the support of Ms. Savitha. Mandalas are intricate, circular patterns that are very detailed, and beautiful to look at. Ms. Ami, avolunteer from the U.S.A, is being actively involved in bringing out the hidden talents fromour

trainees. Breaking all the stereotypes, not only were they excited tolearn the intricate art and create masterpieces, but it also had tremendous improvement on their fine motor skill and focus. We truly believe that Mandala art is a skill that could be monetized to make one's livelihood.

1. PENCIL & FREEHAND DRAWING

Ms. Bhavani, a volunteer with SiA, conducted a series of sessions on freehand& pencil drawing. Students were taught how to do simple, beautiful drawing techniques. Students responded in innovative ways and eventually gained confidence to even try out the Doodle Art Techniques.

2. PAPER DOLL MAKING

The session was conducted by Ms. Rekha and Ms. Uma from Sibling and Volunteer. This session was to show that there is no cap and limit on creativity, and almost any household item can be turned into a creating a masterpiece art. Students worked on preparing paper rolls for the sessionand this not only opened up their creative taps, it also helped them develop their fine motor skills.

Music is a reinforcing experience and is used as a therapeutic intervention for persons with disabilities across all ages. 
