Seva-in-action(SiA) is an organization working with the ideology of Inclusion and equitable opportunities for persons with disabilities for the last 32 years. SiA approach and models of inclusive education has been replicated by the education system government systems to adopt this models at teacher education level. The three year project which ended this year with UNICEF DSERT and RV education consortium to develop a model for incorporating inclusive education in preservice teacher education resulted in developing user friendly inclusive education resource kit for mainstream school teachers for developing inclusive education at classroom. SiA had the opportunity to share about the above model and other resources in IE with NCERT, New Delhi for adaption in the UNESCO guidelines for pre- service teacher education for the Indian context.

SiA having the responsibility of SNAC under National Trust (MSJ&E) enabled us to sensitize the government, organizations and parents group in reaching out services and creating opportunities in the area of vocation and livelihood. Collaboration with NIMHANS provided us withan opportunity to organize a seminar on recent trends for habilitation and inclusion for Intellectual and developmental disabilities. This seminar brought together professionals, role models, parents care givers, students and practioners in one platform.

Seva-in-Action is humbled by the National award it has received from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment by the president of India in the field of CBR and inclusive education. This calls for the organization to live up with its work in creating inclusion and equitable opportunities for PWDS. Seva-in-Action is thankful to the Department of Empowerment of Disabled of Karnataka for funding the information centre and NIMHANS for providing the necessary logistic for running the centre in its premises. Year at a Glance

Sharing of Inclusive Pre-service Teacher Education model with NCERT and UNESCO at National level.

The three year project which ended this year with UNICEF DSERT and RV education consortium to develop a model for incorporating inclusive education in pre-service teacher resulted in developing user friendly inclusive education resource kit for mainstream school teachers for practicing inclusive education at classroom and school level. The above model and SiA research and resources in inclusive education was shared with NCERT, New Delhi for adaption in the UNESCO guidelines for pre-service teacher education in Indian context. The guideline has been published in Hindi by NCERT.

Sensitizing about Emerging trends in inclusion and habilitation of persons with intellectual disabilities.

In landmark development, the United Nations Convention on Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD) has provided with the guiding principle of evolving capacity of people with disabilities and their right to have their identity and recognition and quality life in the society. This development is particularly significant for persons with intellectual disability, autism spectrum disorders and cerebral palsy (collectively known as intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). In this context a conference was organized in collaboration with NIMHANS with the aim to sensitize the professional and working groups about the challenges and issues faced by persons with IDD in inclusive education and habilitation in society, and various approaches to deal with the same. This conference received overwhelming response from NGOs parents and practioners and students which showed the need for such dialogues and discussions.

Skill Development and preparing for Livelihood for Adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Skill development and livelihood has been an important component for providing quality life for intellectual disabilities SiA has been working on developing appropriate curriculum in prevocational for equipping the adults specially adults above 16 years in skills for meaning employment and livelihood opportunities.. Rachana the production center of SiA has also developed various types of innovative products through upcycling of used flowers like holicolors Rangoli colors and pot pouri.

Empowering PWIDDs through Self-Advocacy (SAFI)

Self-Advocacy Forum of India of intellectual disabilities is the forum to give them a voice and provide them an opportunity to share their ideas and needs in their journey of becoming independent and to be part of the nation development. This year Kum. Mahalakshmi trainee of SiA elected as National Vice President and shared the daiswithHonorable Governor of Karnataka, Shri. VajubhaiVala. Mahalakshmias an elected national president of SAFI. She delivered the welcome speech and took part in the inaugural function. Deepak an alumni of SiA from Ramnagar became the treasurer of the SAFI.

QUIZABLED 2017 - A special Quiz Event

Quizabled 2017 was conducted in collaboration with L&T InfoTech, Bengaluru with the support of '1 Step - a CSR initiative of L&T InfoTech Bengaluru unique quiz event of Seva-in-Action which provides opportunities to differently abled children & adults to participate and showcase their knowledge, intellectual abilities, problem solving nature and their hidden potentials for participation in an event of this nature. This year there were more number of children with intellectual disabilities and their participation was a great learning for everyone to realize the evolving potentials of children with intellectual disabilities in the manner they participated in the quiz. This event also changed the mindset of the special educators and parents who thought these children do not have the potential to participate in a quiz.

Creating awareness and changing mindsets

• Sensitization Programme for students from Higher Secondary School

Seva-in-Action organized a Sensitization programme for students from Higher Secondary School of Sri Saraswathi Vidyanikethan, Dommasandra, Anekal Taluk on 'Inclusion & Disability' on the occasion of theInternational Day of people with Disabilityunder NT's Badhte Kadam - Disability Awareness Programme at Educational Institute. The quiz with the theme of 'Inclusion & Disability' was conducted for Grade 9 students and the Participant students understood that if children with disabilities are given opportunities they too can study and reach higher heights. Over all the sensitization program went well with overwhelming responses from both students and teachers of SSVK and they wanted it to be conducted every year for grade 9 students.

• Inclusive Independence Day

Nearly 80 School students along with their teachers of Rashtrothana Primary School, Thanisandra celebrated Independence Day with differently abled adults of Seva-in-Action on 15th August 2016 in its premises. The celebration included various activities like speech delivery about freedom fighters. The School students were enlightened about the disabled community. They were told about the importance of accepting differences and being inclusive. It was necessary to do this at a young age to ensure the different people do not remain alienated.

Information Centre for Persons with Disabilities

Information centre which started last year with the support of the Dept of Empowerment of Differently abled and Senior Citizens, GOK and NIMHANS was able to implement the Niramaya scheme, 1604 people have been visited the Information Centre to avail information about welfare schemes of Persons with Disabilities. 1283 Niramaya applications received from different districts of Karnataka were uploaded and 1133 Niramaya cards were approved by NT and

distributed the health cards to DDWOs. Besides Niramaya Health Insurance Scheme, the implementation of Swavalamban Health Insurance Scheme was also started in the Information Centre in collaboration with NIMHANS & with Vidal Health Insurance TPA network so far, 1267 persons (649 PWDs and 618 family members) have been enrolled in the monthly camps conducted.

State Nodal Agency Centre (SNAC)-karnataka of National Trust (NT), MSJ&E, GOI

Seva-in-Action (SiA) has worked as SNAC of NT in Karnataka from June 2010 to June 2017. This year seminar was organized at NIMHANS to NGOs to popularize the schemes of NT and ensure optimal use for the benefit of persons with disabilities by the organizations across Karnataka.

In order to promote Inclusive employment, we organized one day workshop to sensitize NGOs for the need for livelihood opportunities and open wage employment for intellectual disabilities with the support of Enable India.

Recognition of Seva-in-Action

Seva-in-Action won the National Award 2016 as Best NGO for Outstanding Contribution of promoting Inclusive Education & CBR on International Disabilities Day by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt of India.

Resource Kit for Inclusive education was compiled and developed by RVEC in collaboration with **Seva-in-Action** and DSERT under UNICEF Project.

The objective of developing this Resource Kit is to enable teachers to create inclusive learning environment with required resource support.

The Resource Kit comprises the following:

- Subject wise 100 Resource Booklets for Classes 1 8 (Kannada, English, Maths, Science & Social Science)
- A Handbook for Parents Inclusive Education for Children with Special Needs in English & Kannada
- Study Report on Diversity and Inclusion in Classrooms Karnataka Context in English & Kannada
- UNICEF_ILFE_Toolkit in Kannada

The overall goal of this project was to strengthen academic support system and to empower teachers and teacher educators in conceptualising and practicing inclusion. And also the concept of inclusion has been broadened from a focus on disability to celebrating diversity.







2. Skill Development and preparing for Livelihood for Adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (AWIDDs).

IMPLEMENTATION OF VIKAAS - DAY CARE SCHEME of NT at SEVA-IN-ACTION

The Vikaas Day Care Centre was established in Seva-in-Action in the month of October 2016 as the Scheme of Vikaas - Day Care was approved by the National Trust. We set up Activity room, recreation room with the required material & equipment. The Vikaas Scheme is being implemented in Seva-in-Action from November 2016. We have received monthly recurring cost for 7 PWIDDs under BPL and LIG. At present we have 27 Adult with Disabilities in Vikaas scheme.

Yoga Therapy for AWIDDs is being progressed at Vikaas Centre of Seva-in-Action

Mr. Yuva from PRAFULLA OORJA conducted Yoga sessions for Adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities from Rachana Unit of Seva-in-Action twice a week on Mondays and Wednesdays from 10.30am to 1.00 pm on a regular basis. The yoga therapy commenced in the month of June 2015 and is going on till date.

These sessions have yielded tremendous results amongst the differently abled adults as changes were noted in the behavior of the students attending the sessions in the beginning itself. They have become more obedient, disciplined and no longer have irrational tendencies.

PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT TRAINING



Adhyapana Trust organized a Personality Development Sessions for 5 weeks on the basis of once in a week for the differently abled adults from Rachana unit of Seva-in-Action. This was conducted by a resource person, Smt. Soumya. Each session was lasted for about 2 hours.

SPORTS DAY

The Sports Day was organised for differently abled individuals by the Amogh Trust. The students from Sevain-Action participated in different games and enjoyed a lot.

4. Reaching out rehabilitation services - Ramanagar & Hoskote

DIRECT SERVICES

SIA has been working in Ramanagara, Ramanagara Dist & Hoskote, Bengaluru Rural Dist. through resource centres to provide services such as inclusive education, skill development & livelihood besides supportive systems like medical, counselling and helping pwds to get government facilities. The activities under the rural and urban centres are:-

- 1. Samvardhana Resource Centre, Ramanagara
- 2. Seva-in-Action Resource Centre, Hoskote, Bengaluru Rural Dist.
- 3. 'Action For Inclusion' Urban Resource Centre of Seva-in-Action, Koramangala, Bengaluru

1. Samvardhana Resource Centre, Ramanagara

The centre is providing direct services to 30 beneficiaries under Inclusive Education, Skills Development & livelihood. This year the following activities were carried out:

- 1. There were 8 differently abled students from SiA's Ramanagara Centre were participated in the programme organised by the Govt on the eve of International Day of Persons with Disabilities on 3rd December 2016.
- 2. The Resource teacher assisted 3 students from the Centre to participate in the medical camp organised by SSA in the month of July and got learning material kits.
- 3. SiA helped them to sold 65 sets of candles made by differently abled adults from the centre to the Dept of Differently abled and Senior Citizens office for their world disabled day programme at Bengaluru.
- 4. The vocational group of adults participated in some green skilling and mat weaving activities conducted by the Resource teacher in their centre and supplied 4 kilos of dried petals and 82 woollen mats respectively to Bengaluru Centre of Seva in action for marketing the products. SiA sold the products successfully and reimbursed the amount to the differently abled adults through the Resource teacher of Ramanagara.
- 5. This year, Ramanagara Degree College celebrated women's day and felicitated the resource teacher of Seva-in-Action along with other women achievers in Ramanagara.

2. Seva-in-Action Resource Centre, Hoskote

The centre is providing direct services to 18 beneficiaries under Skills Development & livelihood. This year the following activities were carried out:

- 1. Pritam, intellectually challenged boy from SiA's Hoskote Centre received a learning material kit from the BRC Office on 22/6/2016.
- 2. Seva-in-Action's Hoskote teacher helped 3 differently abled adults to get their aadhaar cards by taking them to the camp along with their parents on 10th July 2016 which was held in GKBMS School, Hoskote.
- 3. She also taken ten students for eye check up to Shankara eye hospital on 20th July 2016. Out of which 7 children needed spectacles which was provided by the eye hospital free of cost.
- 4. Differently abled adults from Hoskote Centre participated in the public function which was organised in Channabhaire Gowda Stadium on the eve of Independence Day.
- 5. They also participated and won prizes in various competitions viz., singing, fancy dress ... organised by the Govt in Hoskote on the eve of International Day of Persons with Disabilities.
- 6. Sowmya and Jayprakash from the centre got their medical certificates
- 7. Sushma and Kiran Kumar from Hoskote Centre attended Quizabled 2017 organised in Bengaluru by Seva-in-Action in collaboration with L&T.
- 8. In the centre, differently abled adults are being imparted the skills in jewellery making, candle making, green skilling... and SiA is helping them in marketing.

RACHANA - Production unit of SiA

Rachana is an initiative of Seva in Action. It was founded and managed by SIA since 2008. The idea is of economic empowerment of Persons withDisabilities (PWD) through Vocational training for those in and around Koramangala. At Rachana, different types of paper bags, candles and bead jewellery are made. This unit also gets help from various volunteers (college students, home makers, etc.) in increasing outputs & selling its products.

Rachana has been getting regular orders from some customers.

Volunteers also contribute to a great extent to Rachana. Rachana also receives clothes and newspapers in the form of donation by people in and around Koramangala.

Many students from Christ University, Bengaluru and other colleges did internship at Seva-in-Action during the summer months. This was as a part of their course to contribute something to the society in the form of social service. They worked with the differently abled students from Seva-in-Action in Production.

MARKETING







8. Information Centre (IC) for Persons with Disabilities

The information centre has been established by the joint effort of the Dept of Empowerment of Differently abled & Senior Citizens, NIMHANS & Seva-in-Action (SiA) in the premises of NIMHANS. It is the convergence between the State Government (DED&SCs), National Institute (NIMHANS) and NGO (Seva-in-Action).

The IC has been run by the Seva-in-Action and it has started functioning completely w.e.f 22/4/2016 by appointing Mr. Ashok, MSW graduate as a full time worker for the Centre. It has been funded by the Dept of Empowerment of Differently abled and Senior Citizens, GOK for effective implementation of NIRAMAYA scheme with necessary budget allocation, and the place & the logistic support by the NIMHANS, Bengaluru.

Niramaya Health Insurance Scheme

This year **1604** people have been visited the Information Centre to avail information about welfare schemes of Persons with Disabilities. **1283** Niramaya applications received from different districts of Karnataka were uploaded and **1133** Niramaya cards were approved by NT and distributed the health cards to DDWOs

Swavlamban Health Insurance Scheme – Family floater

Besides Niramaya Health Insurance Scheme, the implementation of Swavalamban Health Insurance Scheme was also started in the Information Centre in collaboration with NIMHANS & with Vidal Health Insurance TPA network. The enrolment camps were organized on 3rd Saturday of every month in the State Information centre for PWDs since May 2016 and so far, 1267 persons (649 PWDs and 618 family members) have been enrolled in the monthly camps conducted.

Developed MIS for Niramaya health insurance scheme.

Seva-in-Action, SNAC- Karnataka of National Trust has taken the initiative of developing the MIS software 'Goonjan' for Niramaya Health Insurance scheme with the support of Dhwani Foundation with the supporting fund of the Dept of Empowerment of Differently abled & Senior Citizens (GOK). Oriented 20 members from 15 ROs on MIS by Mr. Tarun from Dhwani Foundation and asked them to work on MIS practically.

Officers from the National Trust visited the Information Centre

Mr. Santosh Mohanty, Deputy Director (Programs), National Trust visited the Information Centre on 1st July 2016 and Mr. U.K Shukla, Asst Legal Advisor from National Trust visited the Information Centre on 7th February 2017.

Mr. Ashok from Information Centre, oriented MRWs and VRWs on Niramaya and Swavlamban Health Insurance scheme in 1 day training programme organised by the DDWOs of Bidar and Tumkur District on 15th March 2017 and on 31st March 2017 respectively. Totally 250 members in Tumkur and 350 members in Bidar participated in the training programme.

FACTS ABOUT SEVA-IN-ACTION

Seva-in-Action (SiA) was formally launched in the year 1985, realizing the wide gap between needs and provisions for the services of persons with disabilities. SiA set out with identifying and reaching out services to children with disabilities (cwds) through Community based rehabilitation(CBR) programme and inclusive education(IE). The entire programme is based on demystifying and transferring technology in simple and relevant terms through use of local resources such families of persons with disabilities, local community schools and other resources at community level. Initially the support came from funding agencies such as Action Aid, UNICEF, Norad, DANIDA besides the State Govt and Govt of India for developing services in the field of CBR and IE through capacity building of the education system and teacher education programmes. At present SiA is working in the following areas:

- Community BasedActivities (CBA) for children &adults with disabilities through Resource Centres in Ramanagara and Hoskote.
- Skill development (pre-vocational & vocational training) and livelihood for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- Action for Inclusion Research, Pre-service and in-service teacher education & Resource Development for Inclusive Education
- State Information Centre for persons with disabilities
- International consultancy for organizations working in the area of Inclusive Education (Ethiopia, East Africa)

SiA has been very closely working with the state and central government to plan and develop policies for Persons with Disabilities (pwds). SiA has consultative status to MHRD GOI in supporting and promoting inclusive education in the country. SiA was State nodal agency centre (SNAC) of the National Trust, MSJ&E, GOI for Karnataka from June 2010 to June 2017.

CHANGING LIVES OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES



Mahalakshmi is employed now with Star Bazar and earning her livelihood. She is 31 years old with Cerebral palsy and mild intellectual disability with her left limbs affected with pronounced disability. She was very shy and quiet person and stayed pretty much to herself, with a overprotective mother Mahalaxmi dropped out of school after studying till Grade 7 and whiling away time at home without any further opportunities for her physical or intellectual engagement.

Mahalaxmi was introduced to SiA where received training in the Skill Development unit of Seva-in-Action to work and learn life skills and enhance her potential further through Self Advocacy training. As the first president of Self Advocates Forum of India (SAFI), she attended many National conventions held in New Delhi, Rajasthan & Bengaluru and this year, she was elected as Vice President of SAFI. She underwent job readiness training in Seva-in-Action before she was placed on the job training at Koramangala Star Bazaar for one month. Now she is working as a Star Bazaar employee and receiving Rs. 11,435/- as first installment. Her mother was very happy as her daughter can also live independently like her other children.
